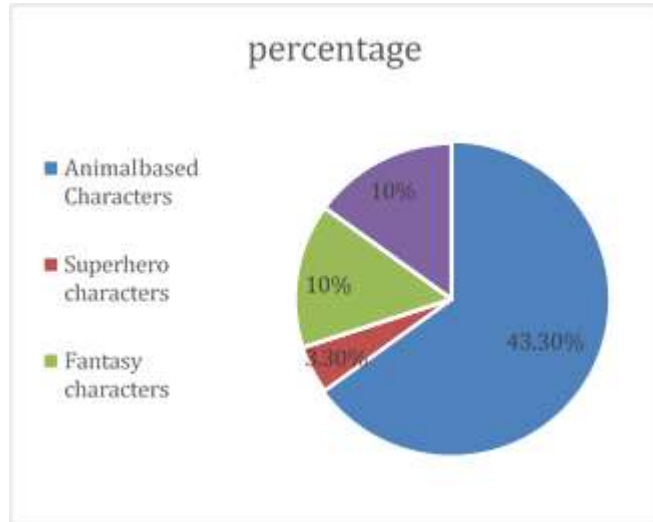


#### Childs Favourite Cartoon Character

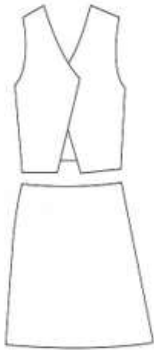

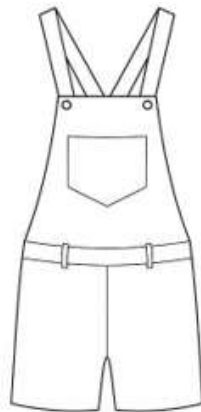




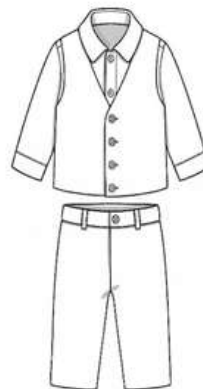
